Our thoughts are with our neighbours, Neskonlith Lake, Adams Lake, and Skwlāx te Secwepemcúlecw and their Band members impacted by these memories.

This statutory holiday honours survivors, their families, and communities, and ensures that public commemoration of the history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process.

To mark the day, flags in the Municipality will be lowered to half-mast.
